The context of the questions:

2. Questions concerning the tools and frameworks they employ to support immigrant and refugee women in the host society and labour market. Insights into their current work.
3. Questions concerning the potential obstacles they faced while trying to support the target group in their process of integration, particularly in finding employment.
4. Questions concerning their potential suggestions/opinions for solutions and tools to overcome these barriers.

Sample questions:

- What is the name of your group/organization/institution?
- In which field do you mainly work and for how long have you been operating?
- What are the prerogatives and aims of your organization/institution or group?
- What kind of people do you work with? (optional)
- Are there any specific tools and frameworks that you use to support immigrant and refugees (women) in the process of entering the labour market? (educational, practical, professional, etc...)
- What are the main challenges that you encounter during your work?
- In your opinion, what elements trigger these challenges?
- Do you believe that there is enough support in your country for the integration of immigrant and refugee women in the labour market?
